Culinary.

As well as being an excellent ground cover, Corsican Mint is also used in cooking. It is most famously known as the flavoring in crème de menthe.

Companion Planting.

Corsican Mint is a companion plant to broccoli and cauliflower along with other members of the cabbage family.



ROWTH

Corsican Mint grows to a height of 1in/2.5cm. Corsican Mint does best in shade or partial sun and likes plenty of water.



CULTIVATION

Corsican Mint is fairly disease resistant, although over watering can cause the plant to rot. It is recommended to let the plant dry after each watering.



DESCRIPTION

Corsican Mint is a low growing, dense ground cover with bright green leaves that give of a strong aromatic smell that has been compared to the scent of Pennyroyal. Corsican Mint can be an evergreen in warmer temperatures but does die back in winter and when in a cooler environment.



USES

Corsican Mint is primarily used as a ground cover because unlike other mint varieties, it grows close to the ground. Corsican Mint can be walked upon without drying and is therefore grown between pavers and on walkways.
